Tells the story of the author's mother, who left home at just 15 years old and traveled to Bihar in order to train to be a nurse. The Hunt for Mount Everest

This book tells the story of the 71-year quest to find the world's tallest mountain. Encountering spies, war, political intrigues, and hundreds of mules, camels, yaks, and two zebrules, two English climbers finally set foot on Mount Everest in June of 1921. 301 pages

Welcomed into a family of nomadic water buffalo herders in India, Benanav joins them on their annual spring migration into the Himalayas. A history of the Indian Expeditionary Forces in World War I. Often overlooked, the Indian soldiers who served the British Empire played a crucial role but received mixed reactions from allies and enemies alike. BIO GIDLA


